Thomas Wilson CONDUCTOR

Associate Conductor Thomas Wilson is currently Music Director of the Chamber Orchestra of Colorado Springs (known locally as "Chamber Orchestra of the Springs"), Associate Conductor of the Colorado Springs Philharmonic, and serves on the music faculties at Colorado College and the Colorado Springs Conservatory. He maintains an active schedule of guest conducting and composing, and is an arranger and orchestrator for several studios and prominent solo artists.

Thomas began studying piano at the age of four. Later studies included trumpet, percussion, string bass, voice, conducting and composition. He holds degrees from the University of Northern Colorado, where he graduated summa cum laude and received the School of Music's highest honor-the Departmental Scholar Award—and from Colorado State University.

A strong advocate of collaboration and crossover in the arts, which he views as essential to strengthening arts organizations and music education, Thomas has been a tireless advocate for new music, blending of styles and artistic genres, and creating new and meaningful opportunities for young musicians. His performances and recordings reflect this diversity.

Thomas has been called "someone to watch" and "a very exciting conductor" by Michael Tilson Thomas, one of the foremost conductors of our time.

Cindy Morse guest conductor

Cindy Morse moved to Colorado in 1979, relocating from California, and lives in Woodland Park with her husband Terry. Two of their three children live in Colorado Springs and the third lives in Los Angeles.

Cindy began working for the City of Woodland Park in 1981. She was appointed to the position of City Clerk in 1984. She received her Certified Municipal Clerk designation on September 27, 1993, and her Master Municipal Clerk designation on August 31, 2004. She is one of 37 Master Municipal Clerks in Colorado. As a member of the Colorado Municipal Clerk's Association, Cindy served as Secretary, Vice President and President of this statewide organization. In addition, she served on a variety of committees and was a very active member of CMCA's Train the Trainer Program, teaching Municipal Clerks throughout Colorado. She was honored by CMCA in 2001 as the Municipal Clerk of the Year. She recently served as a member of CMCA's Legislative Committee, working closely with the Colorado Municipal League.

Cindy serves as Chairman of the Board of Directors for CIRSA, the Colorado Intergovernmental Risk Sharing Agency, and has been on their Board since 2003. In addition, she is a Certified Paralegal and served on the Fourth Judicial District Nominating Commission for Teller and El Paso Counties for six years following appointment by Governor Roy Romer. She is active in her community serving on the committee organized to build the Pikes Peak Regional Hospital. She is currently serving a second term as the Chairman of the Board of Trustees for the Hospital. She is also the Chairman of the Board of Directors for the Teller Senior Coalition. She previously served on the Greater Woodland Park Chamber's Board of Directors; was honored in 1992 with their Wagon Boss Award; and currently serves on the Chamber's Wagon Boss Scholarship Committee, one of her favorite groups to work with, to provide scholarships to outstanding students from Woodland Park and Cripple Creek High Schools.

We started as pick-up band for Steve at the June 20th, 2002, Mountain Acoustic Music Association Celtic Concert. Steve had met Kent Hiestand, a piper, and Ron Sommers at the Sunday afternoon Irish Traditional Sessions at Jack Quinn's Pub. Then Ron started asking first Steve then Kent to fill in for Finn MacCool at a regular gig until they were the only ones showing up. Finally they were asked to fill in at an Open Stage performance at BRAS when Ron suggested adding Heidi with whom he had played in Finn MacCool, and Steve and Kent knew from Sunday Sessions, and we decided to officially make ourselves into a band. In March 2003, Kent left the band and Kari Wilson joined. Kari previously sang

television shows including her own Buena Vista Television sitcom, Nobody's Angel. She guest stars in the ABC sitcom Boy Meets World and the Disney movie Model Behavior with Justin Timberlake. She has worked with Wayne Brady, Queen Latifah, Ryan Seacrest, Jordon Knight (New Kids on the Block), A.J. McLean (Backstreet Boy) & Jeremy Lobbock (Grammy Award-winning composer.)

Amy Sue has a real passion for live theater and finds herself drawn to musicals. Some of her most memorable shows are The Drowsy Chaperone (Drowsy - 2013 - Best Actress Bronze from the Gazette and Broadwayworld.com Best Actress in a Muscial nominee), Return to the Forbidden Planet (Gloria), Sweet Charity (Charity), Hot Mikado!(Yum-Yum), Grease (Sandy), Damn Yankees! (Lola), Joseph (Narrator), The Fantasticks (Luisa), The Secret Garden (Lily), and 1940's Radio Hour (Connie Miller). In 2006, The Denver Post nominated Amy Sue for Best Actress in a musical for her portrayal of Mabel in the Pirates of Penzance. 
